Pray for the elections in the Caribbean Region, e.g. Guyana and Suriname. Pray that the campaigns may be peaceful and fair and that the outcome of the elections may bring forth critical and objective parliamentarians and governments which have the interest of the people in mind, leading the nations to peace, welfare, and prosperity.

Give thanks and praise for the sisters and brothers of Kernersville Moravian, Calvary Moravian in Winston-Salem, Palmer Township Moravian in Easton, Pennsylvania, and Home Moravian in Winston-Salem, who have gathered items and packed Birthing Kits and Layettes of Love, which will be sent to Honduras and Tanzania for new mothers and their newborn babies so that they may have clean and healthy births and a fresh new start in the lives of their babies.
