The earthquake struck on a Saturday, the day when the congregations in Baneswor (Kathmandu) and Khokona meet for worship. This was a real blessing as most of the congregations were together in one of the two places. Thankfully, there were no deaths among the congregations, but many people had homes damaged or destroyed. Many from the two congregations came together in a rice paddy field where temporary accommodation was put up. This was their home for a number of days.
